- A sense of belonging is important in a community. Make sure all children have a sense of belonging in your classroom. Find ways to connect with children whose behavior is a cry for support, instead of excluding them which destroys their sense of belonging.
- It's okay to let go of being a perfectionist and be an improvenist instead.

+ Building Community in the Classroom:

- 1. Authentic Connections: Building a classroom community is not about one-time activities but involves ongoing, authentic interactions. Educators should talk to children as equals, explaining concepts and fostering a sense of belonging.
- **2. Handeling Challenges:** When a child struggles, it's an opportunity to reinforce community values. Educators should respond with understanding and support rather than frustration and chastisement.

Practical Strategies:

- **1. Model Positive Behavior:** How educators speak to and about children sets the tone for peer interactions. Children mimic adult behavior, so positive modeling is crucial.
- **2.** Collaborate With Children: Involve children in problem-solving and decision-making. This empowers them and reinforces their role in the community.
- **3.** Address Misbehavior Constructively: View misbehavior as a cry for help. Approach it with empathy, understanding the underlying needs rather than focusing solely on the behavior.
