1. Take the CLASS 2nd Edition Observer Transition Course (asynchronous online or live facilitated).
2. Recertify on CLASS 2nd Edition.
3. [Optional] Complete the online Observer Support Series courses as they are released.
4. Complete the 2nd Edition Observation Training Onboarding Course for existing Affiliate Trainers in Spring 2023.
5. Prep to deliver 2nd Edition Observation Training as needed.

2022-2023 Affiliate CLASS Trainer Recertification Things to Know

- We're disabling the Knowledge Test until Spring 2023. While you'll just need to complete the observer portion of the recertification test, our system will continue to track your trainer certifications.
- Regardless of whether you take the CLASS 2nd Edition Observer recertification test, your Trainer Certification will remain CLASS 2008 for now.
- Affiliate CLASS Trainers will be able to become 2nd Edition Affiliate CLASS Trainers in the spring by completing the onboarding process for 2nd Edition CLASS Observation Training.
